Sheriff Hutton Road Vehicle Activated Sign installation

- City of York Council is to install a new vehicle activated sign on Sheriff Hutton Road to improve driver awareness of pedestrians crossing south of the humpback bridge over the river Foss.
- The works will be carried over the first two Mondays in February.
- The works breakdown as follows:
 - Monday 6th February 2017: New sign post installed.
 - Monday 13th February 2017: Sign installed and commissioned.
- The scheme provide a sign on the approach to the bridge warning drivers of the potential for pedestrians crossing the road south of the bridge. The sign consists of two elements, a standard exclamation mark warning sign with a supplementary plate including the text 'Pedestrians crossing' and to provide a further message a vehicle activated LED sign plate which flashes the text 'SLOW DOWN' mounted underneath. The LED text would be activated based on vehicle approach speed. The sign will be solar powered to reduce ongoing costs.
- Temporary traffic signals will be provided to keep the workforce safe for the duration of the works.
- As with any construction work, there is likely to be a certain amount of disruption and inconvenience. Everything reasonably possible will be done to keep this to a minimum and work has been planned to minimize disruption.
- The work will be carried out by SWARCO, who will be responsible for site safety and maintaining access.
